Brake and Clutch Fluid Maintenance

Both the brake and clutch systems on Corvettes (C4 and newer generations for hydraulic clutch) use some type of brake fluid as the working fluid. Some early C4 (1984-1986?) cars used a special GM hydraulic fluid with special friction modifiers added. Generally, you can use DOT 3, 4 or 5.1 in your Corvette brake or clutch system. The major difference between these three fluids is the dry/wet boiling point. The higher the DOT number the higher the boiling points. There are some other differences, but boiling point impacts us the most. Some manufacturers sell brake fluid with much higher boiling points. You can replace your current DOT 3/4 fluid in your system with DOT 5.1. It is usually not recommended to mix them, but in a pinch you can.

DOT 3, 4 and 5.1 are all hygroscopic. That means it will absorb water from the humidity in the air around it. And we have plenty of humidity here in Florida! Moisture laden brake fluid can lead to corrosion and/or rust of the brake components that it is in contact with. In addition, you could start to feel mushy or soft brake pedal when you trying to stop. Brake fluid may have a slightly fishy smell and has a different (silky) feel than engine oil. Photo 1 shows the different colors of fresh and used brake fluids.

When my wife and bought our 2007 C6 Z06 it had only 5400 miles on it. I did not initially believe I needed to think about some of my usual periodic maintenance items for the new car since it had so few miles on it. This is an incorrect assumption for brake and clutch fluid. Time and humidity are the enemies of most brake fluid. Most vehicle manufacturers recommend changing the brake fluid every two years. If you are racing your Corvette, you need to do it more often.

Our Corvette had very dark fluid in both the clutch and brake master cylinder reservoirs. I decided I would change the fluid in both systems to DOT 5.1 made by Bosch. It is definitely yellow and not clear like DOT 3 and 4. Matches our yellow car.




Photo 2 – Special tools recommended to perform fluid replacement. Small and large syringe, tubing and bottle to catch old brake fluid.

The clutch hydraulic system on our C6Z does not have the capability to bleed the system. There is not a bleed screw on the slave cylinder. But there is an alternative method to replace most of the fluid. It is called the Ranger Method. I will not go into the details of how it is done but here are the basic steps. Check the internet for more detailed steps of the Ranger Method.

- Remove cap. Be sure to protect your Corvette paint during this and all other brake fluid activities.
- b) Draw all the fluid out of the reservoir using a syringe. Refill with new brake fluid.
- c) With engine off, pump the clutch pedal full top to bottom 30 times.
- Reinspect the fluid in the reservoir. If it is not clear or slightly yellow, repeat steps
 through d). Repeat as required.
- e) Clean the cap and diaphragm and install on reservoir.

For our brake system I drained and refilled the reservoir three times as you can not fully remove all the fluid through the single fill cap. There is a partition with a small slot to allow filling between the front and rear sections of the reservoir. Once I had done that, I was ready to bleed the brakes and remove most of the old brake fluid from the system. The ABS portion of the brake system will not be accessible during the following system bleed method. A small amount of old fluid will be trapped there. But during future brake fluid maintenance this small amount will eventually be replaced. I plan to change the clutch and brake system fluid at least once per year.

The service manual for our 2007 C6Z suggests that the brakes be bled in a specific order: RR, LF, LR and then RF and since the calipers on our C6Z have two bleed screws bleed the inside first then the outside.

Traditionally, bleeding the brakes has been a two-person job. One person to step on and

This took 5 or 6 times with the dirty clutch fluid. I also removed the brake fluid from our brake cylinder reservoir the same time I removed it from the clutch reservoir. Photo 3 is a picture of the fluid that first came out of the clutch and brake reservoirs.

then release the brake pedal and the second to open and close the bleed screw. This must be carefully coordinated to not draw air back into the system and successfully bleed the brakes.

In the past, I have discovered that even shade tree Corvette mechanics can bleed brakes solo. I first used an inexpensive vacuum brake bleed system many decades ago and still have the system. See Photo 4. There are also pressure bleed systems that pressurize the master cylinder, but they are expensive (\$300) and mostly used by dealerships and professionals.

But a few years ago, I have discovered (in my opinion) is a better method of solo brake bleeding, Speed Bleeder Screws. Replacing all your brake caliper original bleed screws with speed bleeder screws makes bleeding brakes an amazingly easy solo task. See Photo 5 for the workings of a speed bleeder.

desired speed bleeder less than a complete turn and then ensured the master cylinder reservoir was full and then climbed into the car and pressed the brake pedal to the floor and released it until clean new fluid came




Photo 5 – How a speed bleeder works. Courtesy of Russell Performance *. Cost is about \$12-15 for a pair.

I replaced all 8 of the caliper stock bleeder screws with speed bleeder screws. I then attached a tube to the inside speed bleeder screw and ran the tube into a catch bottle in a convenient holder, so it was secure. See photos 6 and 7 on next page.

To use the speed bleeders and bleed each corner of the car, I simply cracked open the

out the bleeder screw. I found that it took between 10-15 brake pedal full down and release cycles to bleed all the old fluid out of the brake lines and caliper piston cavities for the inside bleeder screws. The outside bleeder screws took between 8-12 brake pedal full down and release cycles to get clean new fluid out of the bleed screws.

I took a small sample of each bleed screw output at the end to verify that the fluid was the same color as the new fluid I put into the brake master cylinder reservoir.

An important note: Please ensure you keep the brake master cylinder reservoir topped off between each bleed screw opening. I found that even with 15 full pedal cycles on our C6Z, there was still sufficient fluid remaining in the reservoir to ensure no air was inadvertently pumped into the brake system. But your system may be different so be careful. Maybe even have your standby second bleed team member monitor the reservoir level and bleed screw output till you learn your car's brake system.

After completing all four corners of our C6Z, I made sure all the bleed screws were adequately tightened, remounted the wheels and tires and took it out for a spin around the neighborhood. I found I had a rock-solid brake pedal and great brake response. •
