Our First Rallye in a Decade

CKCC hosted a NCCC Sanctioned Rallye for the Florida Region on September 17th. There are many types of Rallyes described in the NCCC Competition Manual. At the annual NCCC Convention one of the events is always a Gimmick Rallye. Each car must have a driver and a navigator. At the start, the navigator is given a packet with driving instructions and Gimmick questions that need to be answered along the route. The questions can be fill in the blank, riddles, word scrambles (TALES =TESLA), or finding/ counting items (flamingos, cannons, etc). Cars are started at intervals, so the lead car does not tip off the following cars as to the clues. The directions can be obvious or challenging (take the third right after the Fire Station). Chance or Poker Rallyes are also popular, and usually a component of the event in Florida. The hand is completed by drawing a card at the start, three checkpoints and the finish.

GIMMICK RALLYE

This event consisted of two Gimmick Rallyes – questions along the route before#1, and after #2 Ecklers; and two Chance Rallyes – Driver and Navigator Poker Hands. The starting point was Kelly Park East. The checkpoints were near the Brevard Veteran's Museum, the Moose Lodge, and Eckler's. The finish was at Chaparral Mexican restaurant in Cocoa.

Zach and I started planning this Rallye in April. Initial plans were to end in Cocoa Village, but we could not find a restaurant that had space to set aside for us, and sufficient nearby parking so we changed the route to end at the selected restaurant. We had planned for one of the clues to be within the Brevard Veteran's Museum. Three days before the event we learned they would be having a dedication ceremony for a new memorial statue and there would not be room for us to enter the venue. Fortunately, there was adjacent parking on the other side of the park, and we were able to use that area.

Tammy and Al Sulsona served as our first Rallye checkers, and we found the route was too long before Eckler's and too short

afterward. This would have had Eckler's closed before half of the entrants had passed through the checkpoint. So we shortened the route through South Banana



River Drive and Newfound Harbor, and added a loop through Cocoa Village to give a 2.5 hour course.

The night before the event Steve and Lesley Goodbread served as Rallye Checkers, and with all the rain we had one of the neighborhoods we were going to drive through near Eckler's was close to flood stage (you missed seeing a BelAire and a Mystery machine mailbox). So the paperwork was adjusted one last time, and the packets barely finished printing in time to set up registration Saturday morning,

Merrill worked the checkpoint at Moose Lodge, Steve and Lesley Goodbread worked the checkpoint at Eckler's. Zach and I handled the finish check in.

Lesley Goodbread sold 50/50 tickets at the start and finish. Steve Goodbread ranked the poker hands, and Judi Merrill helped me score the Gimmick Rallyes.

The Gimmick Rallye was designed to be challenging to hopefully eliminate the possibility of ties, yet there were many. Distance was used as the tie-breaker for Gimmick Rallye #1, and the Bonus Questions handed out at the finish were used as tie-breakers for Gimmick Rallye #2. I re-scored all the Gimmick Rallye packets and recalculated finishes, and there were some

I hope time has allowed you all to have forgiven me for the challenge, and you are ready to run another one. It's not posted yet but I understand *Vettes for Fun* is planning one for December 5th, the day after our Toy Run. I would also be happy to assist anyone who wants to take on planning a Rallye. Each of the four events earned 28 points by the workers or 112 for the day. We would have

had more but some of the workers did not sign the waiver (and two were waiting on activation on the National registry). Gimmick #1 – 129 points, Gimmick #2 – 81 points,



Driver –117 points Navigator – 111 points; or 438 points for the day. We again lost a few club points due to lack of signatures on the waiver. As with everything in life, the paperwork always needs to be completed for

full credit. The event earned CKCC 550 points, which should move us up from 11th to 10th place Nationally.

Fall Autocross Season is starting so we should continue to make gains. We need workers to make the events run smoothly and your efforts will help us in the national ranking.





National Council of Corvette Clubs Report

The National Council November meeting will decide the next President, Dave Heinemann or our Florida region RE Deb Murphy. A NCCC member since 1967, Dave has been the NCCC Parliamentarian and President in 2015. Deb has 25 years with NCCC and has a web page to list all her achievements. For the office of Treasurer there are two candidates, Kay Clawson and Ron Zurek. Three positions unopposed are Public Relations – Craig Kamradt, Parliamentarian – Denny Luther, and VP Membership – Steve Johnson.

SAFETY ISSUES AND RULE CHANGES

The NCCC Florida Region had a meeting on September 18. We discussed safety issues, event requirements and many of the rule changes that were proposed at the September NCCC meeting.

Number 1 on the list was WAIVERS MUST BE SIGNED BY EACH INDIVIDUAL at each event, this includes rallyes, car shows, cruiseins and autocrosses. Please note, NCCC doesn't want spouses and friends signing for attendees. Second, any person that violates a required safety rule may be ejected from the event without refund.

COMPETITION MANUAL

NCCC has four National Governors meetings each year in St Louis to handle the business side of our organization. The Regional Competition Directors (RCD) also attend these meetings to work out issues involved in running Autocrosses, Car Shows, Rallyes, etcetera. There is a Competition manual that governs all functions and it is typically updated every two years. There were many changes proposed for the 2022- 2024 manual,

and it had been decided no line item veto would be allowed. While the RCDs make the proposal, the NCCC Governors actually vote on it. A yes vote would have instituted the new manual and a no vote meant continuing to use the 2020-2022 Competition Manual. Several of the proposed changes were very controversial and so the new Manual was rejected. The RCDs have suggested allowing line item voting for the next manual update (2024-2026). At each National Meeting proposed rule changes (by any NCCC member) are discussed and approved, rejected or tabled by the RCDs. They will produce a list of changes by summer 2023 for the Governors to vote on the Competition Manual in Fall 2023.

NCCC SANCTIONS

Two of the changes proposed and approved by the RCDs for the next manual are: 14 sanctions per club per year (we only receive 10 sanctions under current rules). Eliminating ballots in entry packets for People's choice shows.

Our club currently 'buys' sanctions from clubs that do not host sanctioned events to cover the number of events we host. The change from 10 to 14 sanctions is based on the fact that most clubs host a 14 event weekend autocross, and this would be able to occur without buying additional sanctions.

CAR SHOW AND AUTOCROSS ISSUES

There were also several rule clarifications to take effect immediately, including changing the *People's Choice Concourse* name to the *People's Choice Car Show*; allow another judging category like Mayor's Choice; allow

people who are not able to walk an autocross course to use a unpowered mobility vehicle.

A third safety clarification to be put into effect immediately is ELECTRIC VEHICLES USING LITHIUM BATTERIES ARE NOT ALLOWED at our autocrosses or high speed events.

ARTICLE XI

SECTION 1 VOTING

1.1 To vote in the general election the individual must be considered an active member. An active member is defined as a member that has attended at least five (5) general membership meetings during the year.

- 1.2 Voting by proxy or absentee ballot shall not be allowed, except for the general election or with the approval of the Board of Directors.
- 1.3 An absentee ballot may be cast during general elections if the following conditions are met: A. Must be considered an active member, B. Must be filled out, signed, and returned to the nominating committee before the general election. An electronic ballot (email) may be substituted for the written absentee ballot as long as it is sent to at least two of the members of the nominating committee before the general election. If any of the above conditions are not met, the ballot will be null and void.

Ellen also reported that the 2023 NCCC National Convention will be held in Bowling Green, KY and the 2024 NCCC National Convention will be held in Joplin, MO. Dates and more details later.
