Tech Tips By Al Dalluge, CKCC member

C2 Dash Wire Harness Replacement


Shortly after buying my 1964 Stingray in 2000, a close friend of mine who owned a 1957 Thunderbird asked me what the wiring looked like in my car. I replied that it didn't look very good. Actually it looked pretty ratty. His response sort of got my attention. He told me a story about a friend of his that owned a Corvette in the old days. Apparently some faulty wiring caused a short and it caught fire. What was left was a large blob of melted plastic. So, I took a closer look at the wiring under the dash and in the engine compartment and promptly ordered two wiring harnesses. Obviously, I knew nothing about what I was doing, but I did have a bunch of manuals, so I went at it, starting with the interior one first.

Well, tearing it apart wasn't too bad. After removing the driver's seat, the complete steering wheel column out to the rag joint, and the glove box, I was able to finally remove the gauge cluster. Finally, I was able to rip out the rat's nest that passed for a wiring harness. It was at that point that I found the inter-firewall connector and fuse box way up on the firewall. One look at the connector told me that I had no choice but to also replace the engine compartment harness now versus later due to the degradation of the connector box. But, first, I needed to install the dash harness. Of course, since I had the cluster out, it made sense to change all the light bulbs, so back to the parts guy again. Also, since I had the cluster out, I figured it would be a wise thing to disassemble the whole thing and refurbish it. Well, since I was going to do that and I had the glovebox out it also made sense to take out the radio and clock. Notice how this kind of mushrooms? Again, back to my parts guy for a few more parts that I could now replace since the whole blasted dash was apart. When I finally had all the parts, or I thought I did, I discovered that to make all the connections you must bring the cluster into close proximity to the dash so that the wires would reach. Easiest way was to

acquire four pieces of threaded stock about 6 inches long from my friendly hardware store, thread them into the dash and slide the gauge cluster onto them. Ok, now I could reach most of the connections by reaching behind the cluster, but of course, needless to say, not all of them. To get to the oil line and the speedometer and tachometer cables, I needed to lay on the floor under the dash on my back with my head lying on the pedals. At this point, you connect the intra-firewall connector box up under the dash. Now, that is also a trip since you can't ley on your back and kneeling doesn't really work. You sort of contort yourself under the dash and don't forget the new fuses while you are under there.

OK, with that complete, time to do the engine compartment, but decided to reconnect it to the new firewall connector and see it all worked before going any further. Fortunately, I got it right the first try, so onward to reassembling the glovebox and the steering assembly. This was not so bad except for the bolts holding the steering column to the dash frame. These bolts were easy to get out, but not so much putting them back. So, it's back under the dash again, but this time the steering column makes it a tad more difficult since you have the steering wheel in the way. Now, the glovebox is also not a matter of just screwing it into place. Oh no, it comes out in two pieces, the door and the glovebox itself. Also, let us not forget the wire for the light. You must remember to run the wire to the bulb before installing the glovebox or out it comes again. Now, lucky me, the door uses bolts from the bottom to attach it to the box, so under we go again.

Well, after finally getting this all reassembled, I decided the engine compartment was a job for another day. I just could not face attacking that job until I recovered from this one. I learned that when doing a restoration, one must pace oneself, or it's burnout time. Whoops, forgot to reinstall the driver's seat!



ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL TEST N TUNE AUTOCROSS

Sunday, February 19th marked the day of another successful Test n Tune autocross. The day started out early and foggy. The course layout was different than previous autocross events; starting near the parking lot, we ran in the opposite direction and finished on the main

straightaway.

Those who drove enjoyed the course with an average time of 39 - 41 seconds. The fastest time of the day was 34.836 seconds, turned in by CKCC member Jason Brzozowski. Very impressive!

The Rocky Mountain Region has lots of fun things planned for us and some great venues for competition. Denver and the surrounding area is a wonderful place to visit, with something to offer everyone, no matter what your interests are. It is close to the mountains with their beautiful scenery, historic mining towns, resorts, casinos and curvy roads just perfect for cruising in a Corvette.

You'll want to reserve some time to visit one of the country's best zoos, which is right next door. The Denver Botanical Gardens and the Butterfly Pavilion are also great places to visit.
