The basket raffle took in \$800, which the Club donated to the local chapter of the National Kidney Foundation (NKF).







# **Tech Tip** By Paul Lassonde, CKCC member

# **C4 Climate Control Fix**

We have quite a number of C4's in the Club so I want to share my recent experience about a problem and solution on my C4.

Eight months ago I started having trouble with the climate control on my 94. The air conditioning was stuck on high, including the fan, and I could not change it or even shut it off. The display just had three or four dashes showing and that was it. I understand it's a common problem on C4s.

I found a You Tube video that showed how to get the module out, disassemble it and clean all the contacts inside. I did this twice and it worked good for six months, then it started doing the same thing.

I got back on line and Googled the module and found a company called *Automotive Scientific Inc.* and I looked over their parts and gave them a call. They said they would test and upgrade it if I sent it to them. They said as soon as they got it they would call me and tell me what they found. True to their word they did just that and we discussed my issue with the module. They said they could up grade and retest it, if I was agreeable, and call me when it was finished and let me know what I owed. Once again true to their word they called and said it was done and would ship it back. The charge was \$216, which was awesome considering I've seen used ones for sale with no guarantee from \$300 to as high as \$500. The \$216 included a one year warranty. Longer warranties are available for more money.

I installed it and it works better than ever with functions that hadn't been working.

The entire process, including shipping time, was right at a week. I highly recommend this company if you run into the same issue. Everyone I spoke with was very friendly and knowledgable.

Automotive Scientific repairs all sorts of electronic parts for many cars, including throttle bodies, ABS systems and more. They also sell parts. Visit their web site and give them a look.

## Retired Corvette Chief Engineer Shares His "Dream Job" Experiences With Our Club

On April 20, the fourth Corvette Chief Engineer Tom Wallace was going to be in Orlando for a family-get-together. CKCC member Nancy Garwood heard about Wallace's visit through a friend and asked if she thought he would mind sharing his dream job experiences with Corvette Enthusiasts in Brevard County. After Wallace agreed to the visit, Cape Kennedy Corvette Club was able to reserve the largest meeting room at the Cocoa Library and invite Space Coast Vettes club members and other Corvette enthusiasts to attend, which more than 50 did!

Wallace was a great speaker who kept all of us captivated with several interesting stories, including how the design of Corvette was changing during the 2+ years that he was Chief Engineer. First of all, GM went into bankruptcy and plans for changes to GM vehicles were put on hold. That is until the U.S. government discovered that GM trucks and Corvettes were the most profitable among all their vehicle lines.

One of Wallace's stories was about when he took the Corvette staff to a racetrack at Putnam Park to see how the new C6 ZR1 Corvette performed. With the Head of Finance in his car and after racing around the track about 10 times, Wallace hit the brakes hard for a high-speed turn but



the brakes were so hot he could barely slow the car enough to make it. The Financial guy was shocked that the car couldn't be slowed safely and was very concerned about product liability. That's when Wallace told him that the ZR1 needed carbon fiber brakes to make the car brake safely, which cost \$10,000 per car. Needless to say, Wallace got the carbon fiber brakes on the ZR1.

A special thanks to Nancy for arranging Tom's visit. Hopefully he will come back to Brevard again soon.

# **Eckler's Cars & Coffee**

Saturday, April 13th, 15 club members and other guests attended *Eckler's Cars & Coffee*. The event was held at the left end of the building up the delivery ramp to the warehouse.

We arrived at 9 a.m. and enjoyed the complimentary coffee and donuts provided by Eckler's. In the absence of a Guest Speaker usually provided by Eckler's, our Club President, Bill Shearer, provided tips for preparing your Corvette for a judged car show, which he better referred to as, "What did I miss?" Member Dick Merrill brought his 2015 Stingray for Bill to use as an example of how to prepare your car for judging.

Once you believe your car is ready to show, get a second pair of eyes to look it over and point out areas you missed, i.e. "dead" wax. Suggestion number one, at the show, open your hood. Most judges will walk on by your car if the hood is not open. Look at the paint, where did you miss something? Look down and in the engine compartment. Clean those areas by using cans

of compressed air, an air hose or a vacuum cleaner. Secure loose tape and wire connections – keep it factory looking. It doesn't matter what upgrades you've made; what matters is how did you prepare the car.

McGuire's makes a detail spray that works well on dashboards and windshield wiper cowlings. Other cleaning products such as Frenzy and Back to Black were also mentioned. Use a lint roller for the inside of the hood to make sure no lint particles are left behind.

### Inside the car

Organize and clean the console and glove compartment or completely empty them out; remove floor mats (judges want to see the carpet) and make sure there is no tell tale lint on the interior. Clean the glass inside and out by having someone inside the car pointing to the areas you might have missed (most wives are really good at pointing out places you missed – LOL!). A mixture consisting of one quart of water with one tablespoon of white vinegar makes a good glass cleaner. If you have hard to remove water spots on your glass, try using a regular paste toothpaste, not a gel and nothing abrasive.

### Outside the car

Be sure to clean inside the gas filler door and the doorframes. Clean wax from around the edges

of all emblems — a soft toothbrush works well. Clean brake calipers, tires and wheels last. Ace Hardware's Frenzy brand was recommended for the tires. Be sure to remove all little stones/ pebbles from the tire tread and wipe down the tires. Using a sock to clean the wheel wells works very well. Clean and wax tailpipe tips in and outside. Clean and wax the wheels – chipping of the clear coat on the wheels may be a deduction in judging. Cover up paint chips on any edges. It's all about, "What did you miss?"

As a thank you for attending, Eckler's provided a 15 percent discount coupon for all those in attendance who might wish to make a purchase before the May 12th deadline.

Cars & Coffee is held the second Saturday of every month. The next one is scheduled for Saturday, May 11th, which also coincides with the monthly New Smyrna Car Show. So next month, join us for Cars & Coffee, donuts and another guest presentation, which concludes just in time to drive to the downtown New Smyrna Car Show on historic Canal Street. May 11th is also the Vettes at the Light car show at Ponce Inlet. Hope to see you at one of these events.
