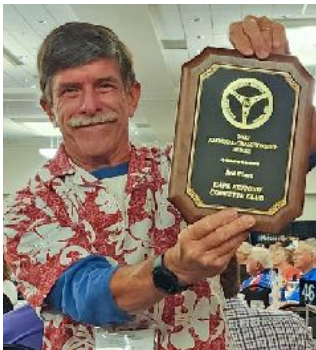

SUNDAY WELCOME & CHAMPIONS DINNER

Events began on Sunday June, 25th with the opening of the Corvette Mall and the Hospitality Room (beer, wine, snacks and great company were plentiful there every day). These rooms were very welcoming gathering places. That night at the Champions Dinner the NCCC 2022

My Trip On A Portion of The Mother Road

As high schooler I fell in love with Corvettes and Marty Milner from the TV show, Route 66. Never dreamed I would actually drive Route 66, until a friend, Terry, who traveled it many times invited me.

In May of 2023 we deadheaded to an Airbnb in Broken Arrow, OK, City of Roses. What a beautiful beginning for the journey as downtown has thousands of rose bushes streetside along with wonderful bronze sculptures. The challenge then began by finding Historic Route 66, 1926-1932, in downtown Tulsa-hidden among major highways and overpasses.



I might add that staying on Route 66 is a challenge even though we were armed with Garmin, Google maps, a route 66 map, and a 2-inch thick book with detailed info/maps. Although it was once a continuous route it is often difficult to follow

since it is now intersected and dissected by major highways, etc. If you're lucky, after a segment of 66 ends and you "finally" find its continuation there will be a Historic Route 66 sign, but that is not always the case. I compare it to a challenging car rally.

Then began the adventure including the search for the "Giants", there are many along the route- our first being the handmade Blue Whale in Catoosa. Met two women, our age, who as children played in the whale and swam in the pond. Stopped at the Will Rogers Museum in Claremore and enjoyed learning about this remarkable man. Crossed



the Rainbow Curve 1923 bridge (only remaining Marsh Arch bridge on 66) in Baxter Springs. In Kansas ran into an old 66 KanOTex gas station that is the



home of the beloved Towmater and his buds. This is the station which gave Disney the idea for "Cars". A 66 Drive-In is still open in Carthage, MO. Spencer, MO had a gorgeous 1925 restored stone Phillips 66 gas station with 12 cent gas. Gay Parita touts a fun 1930 Sinclair Gas Station with all kinds of old



items/trucks including an outhouse and 15 cent gas. Spent some time exploring Springfield, MO as it is the 1926 birthplace of Route 66, the Mother Road. Many sculptures, motels (some in good shape and some not so) and memorabilia there. I even found my first Giant lumberjack and had fun with him! In many of the old towns there were huge, very well done 66 murals. Came across a connection between tiny Marshfield and Cape Canaveral: Marshfield is the birthplace of astronomer Edwin Hubble and the Hubble Space Telescope was launched from the Cape on April 24, 1990. Found a really great 66 museum and gift shop with USA made 66 crafts (bought some) a few

blocks off of 66 in Lebanon, MO in the Laclede County Library of all places! Also there, you can't miss the original Munger Moss Motel. It looked very welcoming and made us wish we made arrangements to stay--next time. Crossed the neat old 66 bridge at Devil's Elbow (a wickedly turning river). Loved the monstrosously Giant Rocker



at the gift shop in Cuba, MO. Took a very long hike (no cars allowed) across the Old Chain of Rocks Route 66 Bridge crossing the



Mississippi River from St. Louis to Illinois. In Worden, IL you have a choice of taking the section of Route 66 from 1926-40 or the



one from 1940-7 decisions, decisions. When hungry we sought out the town square and without exception found delicious hometown restaurants. Mount Olive was a quaint town with a beautifully restored Soulsby's Shell Station. Elkart, IL had a great mural on the side of a large brick building. A Giant Abraham Lincoln was driving a Giant covered wagon in of all places, Lincoln. And in Atlanta, IL found another beloved Lumberjack holding a really huge hot dog! Several places (Atlanta, Lexington, Towanda) had preserved sections of Route 66 that you could leisurely enjoy without other regular traffic. And that about did it as we chose not





to face Chicago traffic especially since it was storming at the time.

Had a lot of fun driving almost entirely back roads as we avoided the major highways whenever possible. At one point Route 66 paralleled a major highway and we were making better time than the traffic on it! Our

trip took almost 2 weeks and we drove about 4,500 miles. If you have time and patience I highly recommend this adventure and hope you will stay at some of the motels on Route 66. Personally, I hope to do the western segment next!

Richard Small and Lynn Nymicks from NCRS were introduced. They gave a brief talk about their event to be held at the American Muscle Car Museum January 24, 2024. This is a regional event that will be Thursday through Saturday. There will be lots of vendors and a swap meet. You can find out more at NCRS.org.

May birthdays and anniversaries were announced.

OFFICER REPORTS

Vice President Dale Lewis announced we need to get a car show committee ready for next year's car show. If you are interested let Dale know.

Secretary Darlissa Salazar was absent. The minutes from the April meeting were postponed so corrections could be made.

Treasurer Maryalice Istvan gave the Treasurers Report. Copies were on the tables. Balance in checking \$11,099.63. Balance in savings \$11,099.63.

Officer at Large Ellen Schwartz thanked everyone for donating baskets for the car show. Letters from the National Kidney Foundation were given to everyone who made donations of baskets or items for the baskets. Ellen also reported that at the NCCC Governors meeting a determination was made that any Corvette is allowed at NCCC events, including the E-Ray. Other electronic vehicles at events will be determined by the region, club, event chairman and venue. Convention update – there are over 700

people attending. There are 50 people registered for the valve cover races. There are still openings for the Country Music Hall of Fame tours.

NCCC Governor Zach Duys reported CKCC is the number one club in the nation with 5883 points. The car show earned 438 points. We had 93 NCCC Drivers and 14 NCCC workers, 66 were CKCC Members and all 14 workers. That means we had 80 members participating. Zach thanked everyone for signing the waivers and writing legibly.

Competition Director Bill Kassebaum reported 7 or 8 CKCC drivers participated in Lakeland Sun and Fun. We have two autocrosses in the fall and will have four autocrosses next year. This year's Porsche Corvette Challenge will be in October. SCC is having a novice weekend at Sebring May 20th. If you are interested see Bill.

Membership Brenda Teixeira introduced new member JoAnn Benti.

Social Calendar Patsy Shearer reported we are working on a trip for the south part of the county, and on a Daytona area trip in January. Janice said we will be talking about caravanning to Bowling Greene and getting information to everyone who would like to join us.

Spoiler Editor, Roger Wolf reported the Spoiler is finished but our web person is on a cruise in Alaska. It has been posted to Facebook. There is a lot of good information in it this month. Bill Kassebaum offered to email it to the membership.

Janice Greene announced that Judy Thompson has resigned from 50/50, and Barbara Young will be replacing her.

CAR SHOW

Janice reported that the car show was a success with many positive comments. She commended the parking group for an excellent job. Registration forms were a hiccup because some members did not put CKCC as their club and were in the wrong voting group.

Judi Merrill asked the membership to suggest any venues for next year to Dale.

Patsy Shearer suggested if we gave a scholarship related to the port that perhaps they would reduce our rate.

Treasurer Maryalice Istvan reported that we made a profit of \$5093.27. \$1393 was donated to the National Kidney Foundation.

New Business:

We have a new sponsor, New Smyrna Beach Chevrolet. They donated a gift basket for the raffle and \$250 for sponsorship.

Janice reported that the Racing Team and the Treasurer both need new laptops. We will be voting on that and new software for QuickBooks. We are also looking at a 3-year progressive dues increase, possibly first year \$10, second year \$10, and third year \$5. For a total of \$25 dues increase. This is something we need to consider.

Sign-in prizes were awarded to Barbara Marshall, Reed Hadley, and Gerald Walsh.

Beef O'Brady's Saturday afternoon has been changed to 4:30.

Judy Thompson thanked everyone for helping to pack the trailer at the car show.

Janice thanked everyone again for helping with the car show. Barbara Lenhard asked the club to reimburse Janice for the golf cart that she used at the car show. She dedicated so much time and helped many people with the golf cart. Janice said this was her contribution.

We did not have a regional picnic this year, but we have had a volunteer for next year. Corvettes in Paradise has offered to have the regional picnic and they are in Naples. They may have a combination rally and picnic to attract more people. In CKCC news, we have 11 new members this year plus four late renewals giving us 15 additional members for a total of 211 members. We have 31 members going to the NCCC convention in Bowling Green.

Competition Director Bill Kassebaum reported we have two autocrosses in the fall, October 21-22, and November 18-19. This year's Porsche Corvette Challenge will be on October 28th, a week after our autocross. Bill announced our members who earned regional awards and will give those to members after the meeting. CKCC was 3rd in the nation for competition points in 2022, and at this time we are still first in the nation for 2023.

Secretary Darlissa Salazar was absent, Ellen Schwartz announced the minutes from the May meeting were on the tables. A motion to accept the May minutes as written was made by Roger Wolf and seconded by Frank. The motion passed.

Officer at Large Ellen Schwartz announced a copy of convention activities were on the tables. There are over 750 members registered for the convention.

Membership Brenda Teixeira introduced Shannon Crosby, daughter of Gary and Syd Merrell, who is interested in becoming a member. Martin Frey and Dan Flynn were also introduced as potential members.

Social Calendar Patsy Shearer announced Sunday Fish Lips in July will be the second Sunday due to the 4th of July and Convention. Janice gave the social committee information about the Murder Mystery Train for a future event. Janice asked members to let us know if there is anything they would like the club to do.

Spoiler Editor, Roger Wolf announced we are in between Spoilers now. We will have one after the convention. We did not find a good location for a club photo and are still looking for a place, probably in the fall.
