CKCC Charities Over The Years

Cape Kennedy Corvette Club has a tradition of donating to many local Charities. We have specifically chosen organizations who keep the donations within Brevard County. When possible, we often support a local chapter of the NCCC national charity. NCCC is very committed to donating to charitable organizations that do not have large salaries going to the principal officers.

COLLEGE STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS

At every meeting we hold a 50/50 raffle and those proceeds are given to the scholarship committee to distribute annually. COVID has had an impact on this fundraising in 2020 and 2021. No scholarship donations were made in 2020 but CKCC donated \$2000 from the Treasury in 2021 to provide scholarship funds.

For about the last 20 years this money has been given to the Eastern Florida State College (formerly BCC) and they choose the individual recipients. This tradition was started when we began using the BCC campus in Palm Bay for our autocrosses. We lost this location for autocrossing in 2016 due to issues they had with another club. However, we have continued giving this scholarship money each year. We have given between \$1500-2000 each year and the club often uses funds from the treasury to round up the number above the 50/50 proceeds. Originally each scholarship was \$250. It was increased to \$500 a few years ago. Initially the club chose the recipients from a pool of applicants in the trades training programs. At some point the club decided to have the college complete the selection process as they could also determine need but not provide that financial information to the club. In 2017 EFSC let the club know they were not getting any applicants that met the 'trades' requirement and the club agreed to

let the scholarship go to a deserving student in any degree program.

PET ADOPTION AGENCY

In 2018 we began Autocrossing at the American Muscle Car Museum. We also began an annual Corvette/Porche AutoX Challenge. Each club chooses 12 drivers to represent them and these drivers contribute \$50 each for the honor. Each club then gives \$500 to the Pieloch Pet Adoption Agency, one of the main charities of the American Muscle Car Museum's owner, Mark Pieloch. While the adoption agency is in Nebraska, where most of his business interests were, he has opened several dog parks in Brevard County as well.

ST. JUDE'S CHILDREN'S RESEARCH HOSPITAL

At this year's Florida Regional Picnic and the recent CKCC Rallye we held 50/50 raffles. The rallyes raised more than \$200 for St. Jude's Children's Research Hospital, the current NCCC National charity.

UKRAINE FAMILIES

Our car show was also held at the American Muscle Car Museum in spring of 2022. It was decided that the proceeds of the 50/50 raffle held at that event would be donated to support families struggling through the conflict in Ukraine, and proceeds were given to the charity called Samaritan's Purse.

POLICE AND FIRE DEPARTMENTS

One year we held the car show at The Avenues in Viera. The 50/50 raffle proceeds of that event were given the Brevard County Sheriff's Office (BCSO). Most of our car recent shows have been held at Port Canaveral, and the proceeds of the 50/50 raffle have been given to Canaveral Fire Rescue (CFR). Each year it receives between \$1000-1200.

MEDICAL AND FINANCIAL AID FOUNDATIONS

The other charities that we give to from basket raffles/silent auction proceeds at the car show are: the National Kidney Foundation (local chapter Rick Salick Kidney Foundation), Make-a-Wish Foundation, Brittany's Wish, and the National Spina Bifida Foundation. Rick Salick Kidney Foundation supports the needs of local families with medical care, and housing near the hospital for parent of children undergoing kidney treatments. Brittany's Wish is a local charity that helps funnel donations through a taxexempt organization and on to local children suffering life-threatening illnesses. We made these donations to help support the grandchild of former CKCC members. Makea-Wish and Spina Bifida were NCCC National Charities. National chose to switch to NKF due to the CEO/Executive salary issues with the National Spina Bifida Foundation. Our club donated to Make-A-Wish for two years and discontinued these donations as they were not being used within our local community.

CHRISTMAS GIFTS FOR LESS FORTUNATE CHILDREN

Our annual Toy Run held the first Saturday in December has given the proceeds of the 50/50 raffle to the BCSO which it uses to purchase Christmas gifts for Cape Canaveral children, and the toys are also given out by the BCSO so that they all stay within Brevard County. We do not work with Toys for Tots, as collections in Brevard often end up in other counties. We typically fill a large trailer and overflow is often put in Sheriff's SUVs. In the past we have also brought canned goods for the Central Brevard Sharing Center and pet food for the Brevard County Animal Shelters (now run by the BCSO). In 2022, the 50/50 raffle raised \$950 for CFR and the BCSO to purchase additional items for disadvantaged youth and seniors in Brevard. The lucky winner was from Space Coast Corvette Club.

FOOD FOR THE NEEDY

Each year at our Christmas party members are requested to bring item(s) valued at \$25+ to be part of a silent auction. We then buy raffle tickets to try to win the item(s), baskets. The proceeds are given the Central Brevard

Sharing Center. Our club again dips into the treasury to round up the donation. The Central Brevard Sharing Center assists disadvantaged Brevard children & families and seniors with hot meals, bagged lunches (when school is out) and a food pantry.

Florida Region of Corvette Clubs was unable to hold a regional picnic and awards ceremony in 2020 or 2021 due to COVID. However, as several clubs continued to host events and pay the sanction fees for these, funds were accumulating in the treasury. So the governing body for the Florida Region decided to split \$5000 between the member clubs for a charity of their choice. There were two conditions: the club had to have donated to that organization during the prior calendar year, and the club had to send someone to the spring NCCC Regional Governor's meeting to make the request. Our club had to choose between Central Brevard Sharing Center, BCSO, National Kidney Foundation, Pieloch Pet Adoption Center or Eastern Florida State College. The club members voted in the order these organizations were listed, and the Florida Region wrote them a check for \$488.

MORE THAN \$37,000 GIVEN SINCE 2017

Covid greatly reduced our charitable giving in 2020 and 2021. Despite this our club has given well over \$37,000 to local and national charities since 2017. CKCC's donations for 2017-2022 were: BCSO, \$4365; Brittany's Wish, \$2100; CFR, \$3823; Eastern Florida State College, \$7000; National Kidney Foundation, \$7950; Pieloch Pet Adoption Center, \$3300 (\$1500 from drivers); Central Brevard Sharing Center, \$4600; Satellite Beach High School Automotive Program, \$500; Cocoa High School Chorus, \$500; Mooseheart charity, \$700; Valiant Air Command, \$500; and Honor Flight, \$500. This does not include the donations of toys, pet food and canned food at the Toy Runs or the 50/50 from that event, which goes as cash directly to the BCSO to purchase more toys for less fortunate children.

Members Enjoy Lighthouse and Exclusive Tours On U.S. Space Force Property

EARLY LAUNCH SYSTEM DISPLAYS

We also visited Hangar C, the oldest structure of its type on the Space Force property, which was built as the Cape's first exclusive missile assembly building. It now displays restored launch systems such as early winged and ballistic missiles, boilerplate capsules and more. As an added treat and thoughtful special touch, a photo collage was on display of Astronauts who owned Corvettes celebrating 50 years.








We were then escorted to Launch Complex 26 at the Air Force Space and Missile Museum. This was like a step back in time when America's first satellite, Explorer, was launched from this location in 1958. Early spaceflight missions took place from this original building. 64TH NCCC CONVENTION

CELEBRATING 70 YEARS OF CORVETTE

Bowling Green, Kentucky June 24th through the 30th, 2023

In 2023, the Annual National Council of Corvette Clubs (NCCC) Convention will be held at the Holiday Inn Convention Center in Bowling Green Kentucky. The dates were chosen specifically to have us there for the 70th Anniversary of the first Corvette rolling off the assembly line in St. Louis, MO. Convention Pass/Badges will be your free ticket to enter the National Corvette Museum (NCM) for the entire week of the convention whenever you desire. There will also be a scavenger hunt at the museum and they will be providing trophies/prizes to be awarded at the breakfast on Friday. Convention attendees

will also be able to purchase tickets to the 70th Anniversary NCM Gala on Friday, June 30.

Currently only people who have purchased a C8 are able to book a museum tour. The convention organizers are working with the plant to have tours available to purchase for all convention attendees on either Monday or Friday. Rebuilding is progressing smoothly at the NCM Motor Sports Park (MSP), and whether you are driving or watching the speed events, there will be viewing areas and possibly a snack bar operational by the time we arrive. Convention attendees can also work directly with the NCM MSP to book

touring laps in the new C8 Z06. Hot laps (lead follow) using your own car can also be booked through NCM MSP. These should be available on the day low-speed events are taking place and possibly other times during the week.

REGISTRATION OPENS FEB. 1 AT 10 AM Day passes will not go on sale until April 1. By that time the speed events and many tours may be sold out so it's best to plan to come for the week. Prices have not been set yet but should be about \$200 per person for the week. The rate increases if booking after March 15 and again after May 1. You must book the convention first and then use your convention number to get the discounts on the hotel. The host hotel is the Holiday Inn Convention Center and a deeply discounted rate of \$108 plus 13 percent tax has been arranged on a block of 300 rooms, which will sell out. The alternative hotel is the Courtyard by Marriott at \$119 plus 13 percent tax. These rooms may sell out, too.

You can find updated convention information at www.corvetttesnccc.org. On the home page choose Conventions, then select the document you want to view. Tours and schedules will get updated frequently between now and February 1. This is also where you will find the registration link on February 1. The convention price includes the Sunday welcome reception and typically the Tuesday and Thursday socials. It also includes the Hospitality Room, which is open four to five hours each day and has free beer, wine and snacks. The Champion's Banquet, all competition events, tours, Awards Breakfast and 70th Anniversary Gala will all be add-ons at an additional cost. You may list two people as participants for the car shows (driver pays, navigator does not). The Rallye and Funkana require a driver and navigator, I believe both have to pay.

The **SUNDAY RECEPTION** is planned as a wine tasting and will have the Museum President Sharon Browner as the keynote speaker. **MONDAY** includes the People's

Choice and Judged Concours car shows, Rallye, Funkana and Champion's Banquet. Our club will be receiving a 3rd place award and I will be receiving a 12th place award at the Champion's Banquet. TUESDAY will be all Drag events and a Funkana. The dinner on your own and evening reception's theme is Team Spirit (Pro, College, any sport). Tours will be Bourbon barrel making/curing and a tasting and General Jackson Show Boat (Nashville). WEDNESDAY will be Low Speed Autocross at NCM MSP. and a different Bourbon Tour today with stops at two distilleries. That evening is open. THURSDAY is the High Speed Autocross (not time trials); Tours to the Ryman Theatre and Grand Olde Opry House or General Jackson Show Boat (Nashville) and that evening will be an Ice Cream Social hosted by ICE (Indiana Corvette Enthusiasts). FRIDAY is the Convention Awards Breakfast and tours of the Corvette plant, a winery, Nashville Auto Museum and possibly the Country Music Hall of Fame. The the final event of the convention is the 70th Anniversary Gala that evening at the NCM with Keynote Speaker Harlan Charles, Corvette Marketing Specialist.

The clubs with a top award, and largest participation have traditionally sponsored portions of the convention events. Our club has reached that level and we have been asked to provide the table decorations for the Tuesday Team Spirit Night. If you have any ideas, please email me at duysmarine@aol.com. The convention organizers are also asking clubs to donate a case of wine from their region for the Sunday Welcome party. Since Florida has better microbreweries than wineries, it might be better to show off our local beers. As we get closer to the event more details will be posted and we will develop plans for caravanning, stop overs, and attire for theme nights. Our club has a tradition of winning the convention Furthest Club Traveled Award (attendees multiplied by the mileage) – and we need to continue this in 2023.

Poor Work Melts Battery Terminal on My C4

My son came home to visit us for Christmas this year. He lives in Oregon and heard about the fire at Phantom fireworks place a few weeks ago all the way out there. He wanted to go have a look, and I let him drive my 1996 Corvette, which one day will be his (he was born in 1996). On the way back home, near the front of our neighborhood, all the lights went out, and the engine stopped. We popped the hood, and the negative battery terminal (on the battery side) was completely melted. We pushed it home. A friend who was helping us push suggested that the connection

was not tight, came loose over time, and caused the problem. A new battery should fix it right up. That was not the case here, but a good reminder to keep those batteries connections tight, and check them often.


To remove the battery from a 1996 Corvette, you must first remove a small access panel on the drivers side at the front wheel well. There is a small hidden 10mm bolt on the bottom, about 4 inches in from the door. This just needs to be loosened, not removed. There is a second 10mm bolt on the top by the door, which must be removed. Finally there are 3 torx T30 screws between the tire and the wheel well that need to be removed. You can turn the wheels all the way to the left to get access, or if you have a small ratchet, with a T30 bit, you can get to them with the wheels facing forward. Once you get those removed,


the panel just slides out, providing access to the battery.

After we removed the useless battery, we used an ohm-meter to measure the resistance between the positive and negative battery terminals (my son recently got a degree in electrical engineering). With the ignition off, and no headlights or anything on, this should

be an open circuit or infinite resistance, and we expected the ohmmeter to show "OL" (over limits, or open loop). This was not the case, we measured some small resistance. Not good. This indicated our positive battery terminal was shorted to ground someplace.

The positive battery cable goes to 3 places, so we checked them one at a time. The first place we checked was to a fuse box on the firewall. We discon-

nected it, measured the battery terminals again, and still there was a short. The second place was to another fuse box located between the battery and the alternator. We disconnected that, and checked again. Still shorted. The third place was to the starter, underneath the car. So we jacked her up, put in some jack stands, grabbed a flashlight and had a look. The problem was immediately obvious. The last person to connect the starter (not me) had the positive battery cable connected in such a way that the metal connector was up against the oil pan. Overtime, it must have worn off enough paint In this picture, the to cause a short. connector is facing straight down toward the camera, and wrapped in electrical tape. Before we fixed it, it was rotated sideways, and touching the oil pan. We loosened the nut on the starter, rotated the connector, tightened it back up, and check the battery terminals. Hurray! it read "OL". We wrapped the connector in electrical tape, removed the jack stands, installed a fresh battery (Advance Auto Parts replaced for free, since it was less than 3 years old). She started right up. Problem solved. We went on to have a Merry Christmas.
