It was a People's Choice judged show and the Lenhard's won a Top 50 trophy for their 1969 and we won one for our Marina Blue 1967 roadster.






Car Suspension Adjustments for Autocross and Track

I believe most Corvette owners know the concept of understeer and oversteer when driving their cars on the street. Understeer is when your Corvette "pushes" through a corner. Oversteer is when your Corvette wants to "spin-out" in a corner. Your Corvette can do both negotiating the same corner depending on how you drive the car. Too much braking when entering a corner will induce understeer. Too much power applied while still in the corner will produce oversteer. Another way to consider the two is "Oversteer is when your ass hits the wall, understeer is when your face hits the wall." See Fig 1 below.

is desirable to have a more balanced car with near neutral handling and limited understeer/ oversteer. You want your Corvette to be neutral without the safety net of "engineered" oversteer. Fortunately, Corvettes have less "engineered" understeer than most other vehicles driven on the street. In addition, later generations of Corvettes (C5 and newer), the suspension can be adjusted using the stock (OEM) parts to improve their handling on an autocross course or track. Corvettes built and delivered with RPO Codes Z51, Z16, Z06/7 or ZR1 have suspensions better prepared for autocross and track events. In addition, these Corvette suspensions may have more suspension tuning range than the base Corvette. But regardless of the model and options you have on your Corvette, the handling on a closed course circuit can be improved without expensive modifications. Some you can



Most new cars, including Corvettes, come from the factory with some amount of understeer "engineered" into the suspension tuning and alignment. This is fine for street driving and occasional closed course driving such as an autocross, as it tends to be a more stable (safer?) vehicle for the normal driver. And it makes the corporate lawyers and bean counters happy. But for those that take their Corvette to an autocross or track regularly, it adjust while you are at the autocross or track event. All you need is a tire pressure gauge as your tires are part of your Corvette suspension. When racing on DOT approved tires air pressure is a major consideration in tuning the handling of your car, especially in cases where suspension adjustments are limited.

Depending on the type of tires you are running on your Corvette the initial tire pressure is usually close to the tire pressure that GM recommends and is listed on the sticker/plate on or near your driver side door. The recommended tire pressure(s) is also specified in your owner's manual. If you have chosen to run more aggressive type of tire (Hoosier A7s), then the tire pressure is not typically what GM has recommended for your car. See Table 1 for DOT race tires like Hoosiers.

Tire pressure can be used to make minor changes to the understeer/oversteer characteristics of your Corvette. To decrease understeer raise the tire pressure in the front tires and/or lower the tire pressure in the rear tires. To decrease oversteer, reverse the As discussed above, when racing on DOT approved tires, air pressure is a major consideration in tuning the handling of your car, especially in cases where suspension adjustments are limited. Table 2 shows some of the other changes you can make to change the balance of the car. Only a few of the items listed on Table 2 can be done if you want to stay in the NCCC Group 1 or 1S Classification. You can adjust tire and wheel sizes if you stay within the NCCC rules. You can also have a racing alignment done which can significantly impact your Corvette handling. But once you start replacing sway bars, springs, shocks, etc., then you quickly move into the realm of ever-increasing cost

pressure changes. Make small adjustments and document your pressures. Make a lap/ run or two to determine if the change helped with the understeer/oversteer condition.

To get even tire wear when using DOT tires you must be very careful not to use too low of a tire pressure. The Hoosier radials can wear unevenly if underinflated and seem to work best at much higher pressures, such as the mid-30s to as high as 50 psi. Underinflation will cause a thin ring of wear at the very edge of the tread. The best results on the Hoosiers seem to come when they are properly inflated, on wide wheels, and with a good amount of negative camber. If properly inflated, these problems can be avoided. Probably the biggest adjustment you can make to improve tire wear is the driver. Avoid sliding the tires, locking up the wheels under braking and drive as smooth as possible.

and reliability issues of race cars. You need to check the current NCCC Rulebook for what modifications you can do to your Corvette for the Group you are running. If you are running your Corvette in a SCCA Solo (Autocross) or track event (Track Sprint or Time Attack) you will need to check the appropriate SCCA rule book. Most later model Corvettes will run in AS (A Street) for autocross or S1 or S2 (Sport 1 or 2) for track events if your car is mostly stock. One of the biggest differences between NCCC and SCCA is that SCCA limits tire tread wear (TW) to 200 or greater for most racing classes/groups. NCCC allows TW of 110 or greater for Group 1S and those cars with TW less than 110 run in Group 1. You can run Hoosiers in SCCA events, but these tires put you in the race car big boy/girl classes.

Tire Pressure in the Rain

For both autocross and road racing, increase tire pressure 6-8 psi from what you would normally run with dry conditions. This is generally only applicable when the track is very wet and it is still raining. A slightly wet or drying track may not need higher tire pressure. Your results may vary. For a very wet track, hydroplaning occurs when a wedge of water develops between the tire and road surface. This wedge can lift the tire off the road and eliminate traction. Increasing the pressure rounds the profile of the tire by decreasing the deflection of the tire. This results in a smaller contact patch - narrower and shorter. It also helps keep the grooves in the tread open so they can channel the water out from under the tire.

If you choose to modify your Corvette beyond the NCCC or SCCA rules for the mostly stock classes/groups, then you are about to enter the rabbit hole of building a race car. Beware. This may help you go faster but that will likely come via expensive parts/ labor and less vehicle reliability since you will likely be stressing your Corvette suspension and drive train beyond what they would experience with stock parts. And every aspiring racer should know that it is still the driver behind the wheel that really determines how fast your Corvette will be on the track. So, get out on the track and get as much seat time as you can before you spend a lot of money and time on your Corvette trying to make it faster.
